

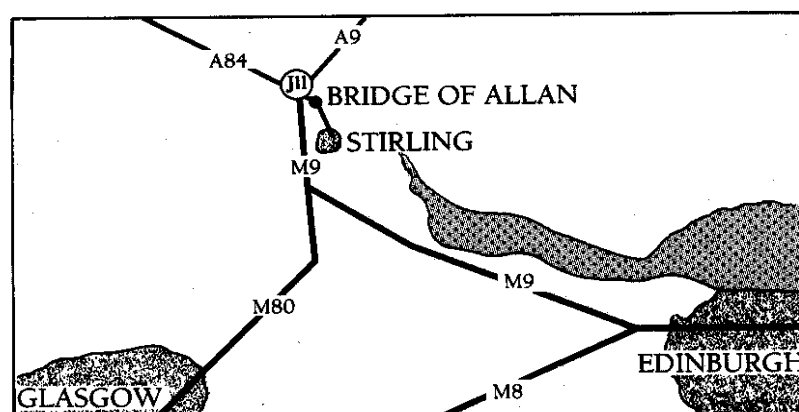
Nestling at the foot of the Ochil Hills, the historic spa town of Bridge of Allan lies just off the M9 on the northern outskirts of Stirling.

History abounds in this region – Stirling, Dunfermline and Perth all having had the title of Capital of Scotland. The famous battlefields of Bannockburn (with its visitor centre) and Sheriffmuire are only a few minutes' drive away.

Edinburgh, Scotland's famous capital city, and Glasgow, European City of Culture 1990, are only 35 minutes away by motorway. Rob Roy's grave at Balquidder, Linlithgow Palace and Hopetoun House, Robert Adam's showpiece, are all within easy reach.

For the sporting enthusiast, fishing in loch or river, shooting, golf (St Andrews, Gleneagles and Carnoustie), are all available in the area.

Ideal as a touring base, the whole spectrum of Scotland's magnificent scenery, from majestic mountains and lochs to beautiful sandy beaches, is available within an hour's drive of Bridge of Allan, giving ample scope for walkers and wildlife enthusiasts alike.



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
